Dear UJCC family,

I'm writing this on the first day of Spring. Just driving around town, we see petals raining from the trees as the wind blows gently. ## The Japanese-American Photo Project

A large box of photographs featuring the Central Valley Japanese-American community from the 1920's - 1940's was donated to Chinatown Revitalization Inc. Most of the photographs do not have any details such as names or dates to identify who was in the pictures. Some have a label indicating that they were shot or developed at Frank Kamiyama's studio on 1413 Tulare Street in Fresno, CA. These photographs depict weddings, military ceremonies, graduations, theater productions, and the everyday lives of Japanese-Americans during that period.

Led by Dr. Kris Clarke, the Japanese-American Photo Project was created by a group of undergraduate social work students at Fresno State. The goal of the students is not only to transcribe information from those who recognize the individuals in the photographs, but also to connect with the stories behind the photographs and to learn more about the Japanese-American culture.

The Japanese-American Photo Project is excited to hold its second photo viewing on Sunday, April 30, 2017, from 12pm to 2pm. It will take place at the United Japanese Christian Church on 136 N. Villa Avenue, Clovis, 93612. This event is open to the public and will be held during fellowship time. We need your help to discover who these people were and to unfold the history behind these photographs. We hope to see you there!




