

Fellowship Time Duties: Toban Chairs will contact 3-5 families to bring items to share for Fellowship Time. Keep in mind that not everyone on a Toban will be called upon every assigned Sunday; if you didn't receive a call from your Toban chairs, you do not need to bring food. However, if you would like to, please let your Toban chairs know. The average number of Fellowship attendance is 75. The assigned Toban will be responsible for setup and clean-up. Please make sure that the kitchen is clean after your assigned Sunday (including emptying the drying rack and taking home any extra food or condiments) as there are other groups who also use the kitchen. There are kitchen cleaning checklists on the kitchen bulletin board; please fill one out after every use and turn in to the office. Thank you for your attention!

Food will be served on one table. Toban members are asked to take home their dirty dishes after Fellowship Time. **Please also bring your own serving platters and utensils** and take them home to wash. Some suggestions of food to bring: sandwiches, finger foods, fruit, cookies, cupcakes, crackers, senbei, etc. We strongly suggest that foods/snacks that are brought do not require utensils to eat. Please keep snacks simple.

Memorial Service Duties: When there is a Memorial Service at UJCC, the Funeral Committee will be in communication with Toban Chairs regarding reception needs, which may include set-up, serving, and clean-up. The Toban will not be responsible for bringing food for the reception.
