Dear UJCC,

Think back to the end of November, to the first Sunday of Advent. During worship, we participated in 5 stations with different themes: Hope, Peace, Love, Joy, and Christ, symbolizing the 5 candles in our Advent wreath. Waiting for the coming of the Christ child, we reflected on how these themes could help prepare our hearts and minds for his birth.

## Finance

The first three months of 2022 have presented challenges for our church finances. Our General Fund investments have lost \$31,803 because of the turmoil caused by inflation and the war in Ukraine. However, our bank balance has increased by \$17,139 resulting in a decrease in our total reserves of only \$14,664. The total General Fund reserves still remain a healthy \$979,172. The Building Fund reserves show a loss of \$6,438 going from \$270,287 to \$263,849.

Although losses are never welcome, our finances remain in good shape.


